EMC – The Leader in Storage and Information Management

- \$8.23 billion in revenue for 2004
 - 32% growth over 2003
- \$2.24 billion in Q1 '05 revenue
 - Systems up 15%
 - Software up 24%
 - Services up 26%
 - VMware: up 104%
- \$7.5 billion cash and investments
 - \$127M spent to buyback 9.8M shares
 - SMARTS: \$253M spent on acquisition
- Employs 24,000 people worldwide
 - 7,200+ service professionals
- Strong strategic partnerships
- Largest IT company and employer in Massachusetts





Challenges to Doing Business in Mass

- Quality of life
 - Cost of housing
 - Commuting time
- Labor costs
 - 25% above the national average according to Economy.com
- Shrinking workforce
 - State's total job count has dropped 5.4% since Feb. '01
- Tax rates
 - CFO magazine rates MA among five worst states in which to do business based on tax rates
