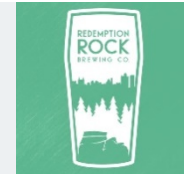
Boston-based cloud health storage company **Wasabi Technologies**, secured **\$68 million** and will open its first European data center later this year. Read more [here](#).
