Boston-based financial services technology startup, **Numerated**, secured **\$15 million** and plans to expand its offerings for commercial banking clients and enter the realm of consumer transactions. Read more [here](#).




Somerville-based Tulip **Interfaces Inc.**, a MIT-born startup that focuses on software to power the industrial IoT, secured **\$24.5 million** to scale operations in Europe. Additionally, Tulip will roughly double in size over the next year, bringing total headcount to 140 people. More than 50 new hires will be based in the Somerville headquarters. Figur8, a new healthtech startup that **emerged out of the MIT Media Lab** and is working to create an objective way to measure and track body movement as a biomarker, secured **\$7.5 million**. The company has been running clinical studies at the orthopedic department at MGH for the past two years and is testing the product in preparation for its commercial push. Read more [here](#).



Waltham-based **Takeoff Technologies**, which wants to automate grocery shopping, secured **\$25 million** to expand its customer base across North America, Europe and Australia, and work on developing autonomous mobile robots known as “open shuttles.” Takeoff’s technology’s grocery-sorting robots are meant to reduce the number and size of grocery stores. The **Baker-Polito Administration** also awarded \$12 million to 45 high schools, colleges and educational institutions that will use the grant to acquire the newest technologies to educate students and expand career education opportunities.
